

MOST COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS:

HOW LONG IS THE CLASS?

The class is 16 hours long. There are 4 hours of classroom time and 12 hours of riding time. We include some extra time for breaks.

WHERE IS THE CLASS HELD?

The class is held at the J. Shuer Center, 4955 Seaman Road in Oregon. This is right on the corner of Seaman and Wynn Roads. (Near Pearson Park)

WHAT IS THE COST?

The class is \$25.00 per person. The money is non-refundable unless you are under 18 years of age.

WILL I RECEIVE INSURANCE DISCOUNTS?

Once you successfully complete the course, you will receive a completion card signed by your instructor. Show this card to your agent. Discounts vary from one company to the next.

WILL I GET MY ENDORSEMENT BY TAKING THE CLASS?

If you successfully complete the course you will receive a completion card. Take this card to any BMV in the STATE OF OHIO within 60 days. This card will waive your riding test for the state. If you are a Michigan resident, the same policy should apply.

WHO PROVIDES THIS COURSE?

The Motorcycle Ohio Program is locally sponsored by the Lucas County Educational Service Center. This sponsor enables the program to be offered in the Toledo area. The curriculum is provided by the Motorcycle Ohio Program and strictly follows guidelines set forth by the Motorcycle Safety Foundation.

WHAT WILL THE CLASS TEACH ME?

The class will begin at a very basic level and graduate to the advanced skills needed while riding in everyday traffic situations. You will begin by learning the four basic riding skills. You will finish with advanced techniques used in real life situations. You will learn how to minimize your risk of harm while riding. You will also learn life saving skills and discuss attitude. This 15-hour course is jam packed with the Do's and Don'ts for today's riders!

WHAT DO I NEED TO PROVIDE?

You must have a valid motorcycle temporary permit or a motorcycle endorsement on your license. This means you must purchase the packet and take a written test. Call your local BMV if you have questions. You must also provide gloves, boots, long sleeve shirt or jacket, long pants and eye protection. As far as eye protection goes, prescription lenses, sun-glasses and face shields are all acceptable.

DO I NEED A HELMET?

Yes. A helmet is a must. We will provide helmets for you. If you wish to wear your own it must be DOT approved ¾ or full faced, and in good shape. No profanity please.

HOW DO I REGISTER?

Fill out the enclosed registration form and mail it along with a \$25.00 cash, check or money order to the address provided on the bottom of the form. Allow yourself (3) class choices. Within 2 weeks you will receive a confirmation letter listing your assigned class and directions to the location. Classes fill quickly and are assigned on a first come first serve basis via mail. Absolutely no classes are held over the phone and/or without the \$25.00 fee. Please register 4-5 weeks in advance if possible.

IS IT OK TO COPY THIS REGISTRATION FORM?

Yes. Copy the form and hand it out to others. If you wish to take the class with a friend or family member we suggest you mail your forms in together along with a note.

IS THE CLASS CANCELLED DUE TO RAIN OR SNOW?

No. We ride no matter what so be prepared and dress accordingly.

WHAT IF I HAVE TO CANCEL?

As long as you call ahead of time, other arrangements can be made to move you to another date. If you do not call, you will not be rescheduled without paying another \$25.00 fee.

WHAT IF I'M LATE TO THE CLASS?

Classroom begins promptly at 6:00p.m. If you are not there by 6:00 your spot will be filled with a standby or walk-in person. Deposit fees will be forfeit. There are no refunds. It is your responsibility to reschedule. The same policy applies to weekend start times as well.
